The Society of Indian Psychologists (SIP) Native-to-Native Mentorship Program is designed to link generations by connecting American Indian, Alaskan Native, Native Hawaiian, Pacific Islander and First Nations Indigenous psychology students and early career professionals with experienced Native psychologists. We match Native individuals who are aspiring for careers in any area of psychology (academic, research, industry, public service, clinical, school, or consulting) with Native mentors and we provide advice, support and training, CEU webinars, and a Native community of support to enhance career and personal development.

This **Program Application** is for a one-year commitment of time with an option to re-enroll for additional years. Matched participants agree to participate in a minimum of four (4) virtual conferences with their mentor or mentee per academic year (2 per semester), as well as to attend the webinar orientation session, and the five-part community-building series *On Becoming a Native Psychologist*. All participants are expected to attend the annual SIP Retreat/Convention in June 2024 held in Logan, Utah.

All Native-to-Native Mentorship Program participants must be *Full, Retired* or *Student* Members of the Society of Indian Psychologists (SIP). Dues (\$50, \$35 or \$10) are assessed annually (June) and must be currently paid for the 2023-2024 year.
